



Golf Courses in Mesquite, Nevada and St. George, Utah

CasaBlanca Golf Club 18 Holes • Par 72 • 7,011 Yards Architect – Cal Olson Director of Golf – Dan Griffin

CasaBlanca is a desert course with 13 of the 18 holes having water on them which provides a challenge to golfers and a habitable wetland for the desert fowl. The Cal Olson designed course meanders naturally through and around the Virgin River and is accommodating to golfers of all skill levels, with its modestly sloping mounds and fairways and five sets of tee markers. The signature hole at CasaBlanca is number 17, which is a lengthy par-four requiring a precise tee shot and an equally accurate longiron second to a green which narrows in the front. Parshooters won't stop smiling all the way to the 18th tee.

Falcon Ridge Golf Club 18 Holes • Par 71 • 6,650 Yards Architect – Kelby Hughes Director of Golf – Brian Wursten

The Falcon Ridge Golf Club is woven through the hills and valleys giving one a feeling of a high desert golf course. The pine trees along with the sculpted fairways add to southwest flavor. Playability is at a premium at Falcon Ridge, having multiple tee boxes it will meet the need of every golfer. The course is set up to give everyone a blend of pure simplicity, spectacular views and demanding holes.

The Palmer Course at the Oasis Golf Club 18 Holes • Par 72 • 6,982 Yards Architect – Arnold Palmer Director of Golf – Randy Tickner

Golfers playing The Palmer Course at Oasis Golf Club won't be surprised to hear that this challenging and scenic wonder was created by Arnold Palmer. And the best advice is vintage Arnie: hitch up your trousers—or skirt—and go for it. The Palmer Course at Oasis Golf Club has several elevated tee boxes with dramatic shots to slot canyon fairways that meander through the foothills surrounding northern Mesquite. The narrow fairways are accented with many bunkers, water hazards, and undulations that leave the golfer with few level lies. But nothing looks or feels artificial here as Palmer used the natural landscape to provide all the drama. The 363-yard sixth hole is representative: the green is set deep within a box canyon that looms over all approach shots. And only the brave need venture to the back tee at the 517-yard eighth hole, which requires a 250-yard drive to clear rugged country.


The Canyons Course at the Oasis Golf Club

18 Holes • Par 71 • 6,408 yards Architect - David Druzisky Director of Golf – Randy Tickner

The recently completed Canyons course at the Oasis Golf Club offers dramatic scenery while requiring well placed golf shots. Like the Palmer Course, the Canyons is blessed with a dramatic changed in elevation throughout, but the perfectly manicured Bermuda fairways are somewhat wider and more user friendly. Golfers will encounter plenty of water hazards on their tour of the Par 71 layout that takes wonderful advantage of its setting. Golfers will especially enjoy the unique par three finishing hole.

Palms Golf Club 18 Holes • Par 72 • 6,514 yards Architect – William Hull Director of Golf – Dan Griffin


The Palms was the first course built in Mesquite and gets credit for igniting the fuse that created the golf explosion here. Set amidst a desert landscape of sagebrush and tumbleweeds the course offers an island of palm trees and lush green fairways with a number of daunting water hazards. The Palms provides golfers with two contrasting nines: the front nine has fairly flat wide fairways with small lakes providing a precision challenge. The back nine takes full advantage of dramatic elevation changes offering incredible vistas, but the serendipity must be occasionally interrupted by forced carries over unforgiving canyons. Most memorable is the 536-yard 15th hole, a par-five that presents a 114-foot drop to the fairway below.



Golf Courses in Mesquite, Nevada and St. George, Utah

The Ledges (Utah)
18 Holes • Par 72 • 7,145 yards
Architect - Matt Dye
Director of Golf - Colby Cowan

The Ledges golf course offers panoramic views of the surrounding mountains, Snow Canyon and red rock cliffs from start to finish. Given the ideal terrain in the foothills, Dye was able to fit the holes into the land making it flow beautifully. His imaginative routing enables golfers to use many of the spectacular peaks as aiming points. Landing areas are generous, but there are enough bunkers, monds and water hazards to keep all golfers on their toes.



Architect - Keith Foster Director of Golf - Gary White

Coral Canyon features 100 acres of manicured fairways, 55 bunkers, two lages and a labyrinth of dry washes through the course, offering players a variety of risk/reward opportunities that are critical to an exceptional golf experience. The golf course offers a rare opportunity for players to enjoy luxurious golf on the doorstep to some of the world's most famed natural wonders. Fairways are generously spacious and most holes allow the less accomplished player to run the ball onto the ultra smooth greens.



Jack Nicklaus' Signature-designed course - The Chase - at PGA Golf Club is a challenging 7,471-yard layout and is the first golf course in a series of Jack Nicklaus Signature Golf Courses that will flow throughout the Coyote Springs community. The Chase's lush rye-grass fairways are set against a dramatic desert backdrop, with mountain vistas in every direction.

Sand Hollow Resort (Utah) 18 holes • Par 72 • 7,300 Yards Architect - John Fought Director of Golf - Mark Whetzel

The Championship Course at Sand Hollow is as visually stunning as it is challenging, moving in and around the world-renown distinctive red rock formations of southern Utah. The Championship Course features elevated tees, wide sweeping fairways and challenging greens. Golfing traditionalists will also love playing the Links Course at Sand Hollow. A throw back to the days of early golf, the Links Course is a stunning nod to the true walking golf experience and rich heritage of the game of golf.



Bryce Canyon National Park

Bryce Canyon National Park, further north and east of Utah's Zion Park, is home to 56 square miles of colorful limestone spires. Bryce is more like an amphitheater than a canyon. It has been described as bizarre statuary which never appears quite the same twice. Names given to the 60-million-year-old shapes include Sinking Ship, Wall Street, Alligator and Queen's Garden.

The park is open all year and offers hiking, horseback riding, camping, ranger-led hikes, geology talks and cross-country skiing. A 37-mile drive takes visitors to dazzling overlooks such as Sunrise, Sunset, Rainbow and Inspiration Point. Snow is common from November through March and provides an opportunity to enjoy cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Spring brings wildflowers which dot the rock formations providing a riot of color.

Grand Canyon National Park

No trip to the Southwest would be complete without a visit to the Grand Canyon National Park. The North Rim offers viewpoints 1,200 feet higher than those on the South Rim. Another attraction is the virgin pine forest of the Kebab Plateau.

One of the "Seven Wonders of the World," the Grand Canyon has been created by the Colorado River carving and eroding its course for the past five million years through the crust of the earth. The irrepressible forces of water and time have revealed secrets of the planet like no other place on Earth. Heavy winter snows cause the North Rim to be closed to visitors from November through early May.

Hiking, camping, sightseeing, photography, wildlife observation, mule rides, ranger programs and picnicking are popular activities when the park is open.

Paved trails offer opportunities to leisurely hike along the North Rim and, at one point, visitors can look down 3,000 feet to see and hear Roaring Springs, a source of drinking water for the Canyon.

More energetic visitors can hike down into the Canyon via the North Kaibab Trail. Options include a hike of a few hundred yards, a nine-mile round trip and a three-day, 14-mile trek to the Canyon below. Along the way, hikers often encounter coyotes, mule deer, bobcats, mountain lions and wild turkeys.

Points of Interest

Lake Mead Recreational Area

Lake Mead National Recreation offers a wealth of things to do and places to go year-round. Its huge lakes cater to boaters, swimmers, sunbathers, and fishermen while its desert rewards hikers, wildlife photographers, and road-side sightseers. This seemingly barren area contains a surprising variety of plants and animals, some of which may be found nowhere else in the world.

Lake Mead was created when Hoover Dam was built during the 1930's. The innovative and technological accomplishments that contributed to this engineering achievement influence other projects. Lake Mead is one of the largest artificially created bodies of water in the world, covering an area of 233 square miles, its shoreline measures 550 miles.



Only a short drive from Mesquite and at the opposite end of the busiest parts of the Lake Mead National Recreation Center lies one of the quieter, more relaxing parts of the lake – Overton Beach Marina. Whether fishing, boating, camping, or just enjoying the fresh air and beautiful scenery, this is the place to visit. The marina offers slip rentals, ample mooring, boat and automobile fuel, a store, snack bar, laundry facilities, showers, campgrounds, and RV Park.

Valley of Fire

Between Mesquite and Las Vegas lies the Valley of Fire State Park. This 26,000-acre desert is Nevada's oldest state park. True to its name, this scenic area features red sandstone formations and strange shapes formed by shifting sand dunes some 150 million years ago.

Prehistoric petroglyphs lie at the end of a half-mile trail. A seven-mile drive offers visitors the opportunity for exploring ancient Indian petroglyphs, photographing brilliant red rock formations, spotting the speedy roadrunner and getting a glimpse of a rare kit fox or spotted skunk.

The Visitor's Center houses educational exhibits which explain the geology, prehistory and ecology of the Park.

Zion National Park

Zion National Park, in Utah, was established in 1919. For 13 million years, the Virgin River has been sculpting and redesigning Zion Canyon. The result is massive 2,000-foot high cliffs, separated by narrow hiking trails and riverbeds. The six-mile road through Zion treats visitors to amazing stone formations and red cliffs with majestic names such as Angels Landing, Great White Throne and the Three Patriarchs.

The park – open all year – dons a new set of colors for each of the four seasons. The park's history is told in the film "Treasure of the Gods" which is projected onto a six-story screen near the entrance to the park.

The park may be toured by vehicle, bicycle or tram. Horseback rides are available. Hiking trails are available and three are accessible by wheelchair, as are some of the camping areas.
